

The Importance of Registering Before December

While a few months remain before the snow flies, it is imperative that all New York state snowmobile owners register their sleds before December. Delaying only stands to harm the amount of funding clubs receive for trail grooming and maintenance.

The Office of Parks and Recreation uses a December cutoff in registrations to determine how many people will use the trail system that coming season. Those who register after the end of November run the risk of not being counted towards the number used to determine the funding allotment.



These funds provide for most of the grooming of trails. Reduced funding directly equals less grooming.

Since you are receiving this newsletter, you registered your sled last season. That means that you planned on riding off your property at some point during the season. Thank you for registering.

However registering is only part of the picture, registering early helps ensure the funding is there

to groom and maintain your favorite trail.

Some people wait to see if there is going to be snow before they plunk down the money to register their sled. This is fine in theory as a way to avoid spending money when they will not ride that season. How often is there a season with no ride able snow? Rare. Even last season had ride able snow, short but sweet.

Other folks may just decide that the snowfall won't come or be enough to ride. They figure that they may only ride once or twice at best. Hopefully that once or twice will not include a run in with the law. Riding an unregistered snowmobile is risky and if caught, carries a stiff fine.

Beyond the fines, unregistered sleds actually damage the trails each time they are ridden. They supply no funding to help groom the trails. They supply no funding for the safety signs found along the trail. They contribute nothing towards the building materials required for bridges. Use without upkeep and repair equals damage.

2008 – 2009 Safe Trails Education Program

NYSSA's Safe Trails Education Program (STEP) is taking shape for this upcoming season. STEP is a two-part program: Signage and Grooming. STEP is the Association's risk management program designed to provide education to clubs making snowmobile trails in New York as safe as possible, recognizing that the ultimate responsibility for safe snowmobiling rests with each individual operator.

The administering agency for snowmobile trails in New York is NYS OPRHP. The Agency has set guidelines for signing snowmobile trails. STEP helps educate clubs of these guidelines so that signing consistency can be achieved.
