

East Berne - Brian Buchardt reports Turner Rd bridge frame in place, decking yet to go on. Lumber is being ordered. Local trail to Highlands needs a little bushing and clearing work. S70 trail is still on hold, awaiting land owner decision. Helped out the Heldeburg club with trail smoothing of very deep hole on the trail leading up to S70. If S70 opens, should provide a nice link between the clubs.

Knox - Ron Shultes checks in with news that the pipeline will be used again this season near Rt146 due to logging in the woods. Please use caution and go slow on the pipeline or the trail will be closed. Be sure to STOP before crossing the driveway on the pipeline. Township trail is ready for the coming season.

Esperance/Sloansville - Laudy Hoyenga has gathered more permission agreements. He has widened and straightened the trail to Sloansville in places. For now the club will continue riding in front of the Esperance Hannaford, just use caution at the parking lot exit crossing.

Duanesburg/Delanson - Rich Valletta advises the C7B bridge in Duanesburg (Scott's Printing) will need to be redecked with plywood and railings put up. The S70 bridge leading into the village of Duanesburg will be inspected to see if replacement is needed. Options are being looked at for the situation above Cooley Heights, it is unknown if we will be able to get through or not.

Burtonsville - John Scrima says all is well at this time. No work parties yet.

Mariaville - Jerry Schoening reports culverts installed last weekend near Stanley Turnpike and in Featherstonaugh State Forest north of Lake Rd. Removed trees, stumps and large rocks along the trail. John Cameron donated the culverts and Matt Harper used his Kubota tractor.

As you can see, things are well underway throughout the Frontier. It's time to call a trail boss and volunteer!






Study Reveals \$868 Million Annual Impact of Snowmobiling in New York State

SYRACUSE, NY – Earlier this year, the New York State Snowmobile Association (NYSSA) tasked the SUNY Potsdam Institute for Applied Research to undertake an <u>economic as-</u> <u>sessment of snowmobiling</u> on the New York State economy. Based on the nearly 6,000 responses, the assessment determined that snowmobiling delivers an economic impact of \$868 million annually. The average annual household expenditure for a snowmobiling season is \$3,561 and an additional \$3,200 for sled expenses that include purchase price and towing.

"This follow-up to the New York State 1998 study shows that, even after adjusting for cost of living and other factors, snowmobiling has been a growing activity during the last decade with significant economic impact for New York State," said Dr. J. Patrick Turbett, Director of SUNY Potsdam Institute for Applied Research.

Broken down by region, snowmobiling has an economic impact of \$245 million in the Adirondacks, \$165 million in the Tug Hill and \$163 million in Central New York. The study showed that snowmobilers spend an average of 22 days on the trails each season, with 8.5 days being spent in another region of the state from where they reside.
