## Club Infrastructure

Where do we as a club stand? Who makes this Club work? How has the Club impacted the local trail riding experience? What resources are available to the Club? All good questions, and all tie into infrastructure.

Club infrastructure includes trails, bridges, culverts, and grooming equipment. Infrastructure is also made up of landowner cooperation, state organizations, grant funding, and member involvement.

A nice smooth and wide trail should not something to take for granted. All the above parts of infrastructure must be present at some level or there will be a less than desirable trail to ride.

Trails are laid out on mostly private property. Ownership can change hands and require new partnerships to be formed. New growth and storm damage can impede the path of the trail. Yearly maintenance is required on all trails, some demand more work than others.

Bridges wear out, due to weathering, floods, and heavy use. Replacement or repair operations

are an ongoing job. Building stronger and better bridges allows for less frequent servicing. The Club maintains a policy of pursuing higher quality structures.

Grooming equipment goes through very harsh conditions requiring periodic maintenance and replacement. The Club is always looking to upgrade the fleet of groomers to larger machines. Bigger machines can groom more and do a better job with fewer passes.

State organizations lend support to the club through membership services and trail improvements. NYSSA, OPRHP, and DEC all contribute to the trail system. Grant funding is how much of the trail improvements are accomplished finically. Counties and towns distribute the funds to the clubs.

## Trail Log

East Berne - A washed out bridge on S70 has been replaced and moved upstream to prevent future problems. Decking the bridge was completed the weekend following Thanksgiving. Two small bridges near the airport will either be rebuilt or replaced with culverts. Signs going up.

Knox - A new bridge frame is in place on C7B near Rt 146. It replaces old pallet bridge sections. The decking should go on shortly. A new local trail to Township has been brushed and opened. Signing is underway.

Esperance - Work is slowly beginning in this area. More help is needed, please contact trail boss Tom Rulison.

Duanesburg/Delanson - Brushing and clearing is 90% complete. The local trail connecting Duanesburg with C7B has been brushed heavily. Signing is well underway.

Burtonsville - DEC will rebuild a bridge on trail C7F in the Charleston State Forest. Signing the trail is on going.

Mariaville - Due to continuing land owner issues in the Mariaville area, snowmobiling may be restricted in this area. Please check the club web site for the latest on whether the trail will open this season. If you live or ride this area and can help reopen this section, please contact trail boss Jerry Schoening.

Schoharie - No report, trail boss needed.





Relationships are formed with all these organizations.

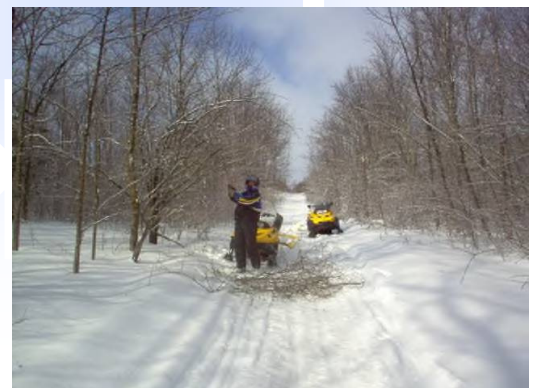



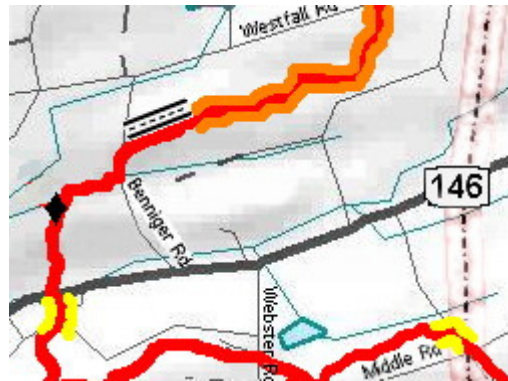


C7E Rt7 to Cole



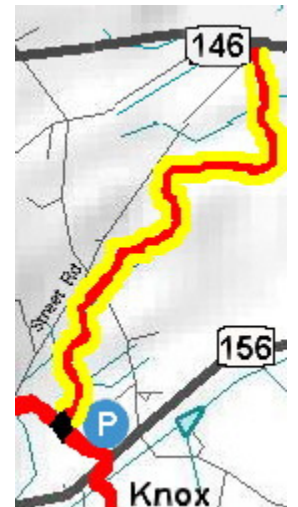

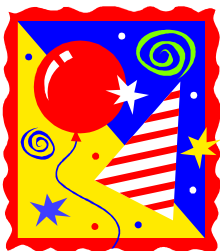

### NYSSA NEWS

#### Trail Coordinator Search Begins

NYSSA's long time Trails Coordinator, Dave Perkins, will be retiring in May 2011. The search for a new Trails Coordinator has begun. Send resumes to resumes@nysnowmobiler.com

#### NYSSA ASKS GOVERNOR PATERSON TO RETURN LAW ENFORCEMENT FUNDS

The Division of Budget is at it again. Recently it was learned that the snowmobile law enforcement budget was hit for \$29,900 as the DOB withheld 1.1% of those funds. Many local assistance payments were affected. Capitol Group was contacted and provided the following explanation: The state budget included \$1.1 billion of anticipated federal Medicaid money. Because that amount began to look like it may be overly optimistic, the Governor insisted the Legislature create a contingency fund that would have enough money to offset reductions in the federal aid number, while still having a balanced budget. The contingency is funded primarily by cuts in healthcare and education, but also by reductions in member items, local assistance and special revenue accounts. It is across the board with few exceptions. In order to meet the contingency targets, the comptroller was authorized to take money from these funds, in the case of Parks, from the snowmobile law enforcement account among other programs. About \$30,000 was cut from law enforcement, reflected in the 1.1% reduction in these local assistance grants. It is not expected that this will impact the trail fund further--unless Parks intends to use other trail fund local assistance money to make law enforcement whole.

### Enjoy the trails, and please note the following:

**State law** prohibits riding on State highways (except at crossings)

**Obey speed limits.**

**Observe and obey** all traffic and snowmobile signs.

**The use of any lake** for snowmobiling is **NOT** recommended as there is no way to determine their safety.

**Keep to the extreme right** and yield right-of-way to pedestrians and automobiles.

Groups must travel in a single line.

**Be considerate** of others.

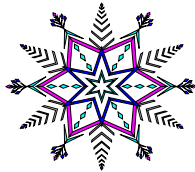
