Trail Grant Season Gets Underway

Just what are these things called grants that we hear about at club meetings and in the newsletter all the time? Why are they getting a lot of attention now?

Grants are money given to Trail Maintenance Entities (clubs) to maintain the trails within each club's area of responsibility.

The grants are disbursed from local sponsors who oversee the different clubs within their boundaries. Sponsors can be municipalities such as a county, town, or an association made up from a number of clubs within a county.



The grants are funded by money taken from the snowmobile registration fees. When you register your snowmobile, you are putting money into maintaining the trails. The more people who register, the more money that goes into the trail funding grants. This means you get better trails to ride on.



New York State Department of Motor Vehicles collects the registration fees and turns most of it over to New York State Office of Parks Recreation and Historical Preservation. OPRHP is more commonly known as Parks and Rec.

Parks and Rec sets up and administers the trail grant program. They determine how much money goes to each club based on trail mileage and classification of the trails. Some clubs receive more money due



to their location in high snowfall areas. The grants are then given to each sponsor, who in turn awards the grants to the clubs. Some sponsors will have

many clubs and others only one.

Why all the attention on grants at this time? For the clubs, this is a very busy time; the end of the yearly grant cycle is here. March 31 marks the end of the snowmobile grant year. This is when all work logs are closed out, meaning any work done on the trails over the past 12 months, must have been logged to be counted for the grants. Any work done after March 31 counts toward the next year.





Phase III of the grant application, Post Project submissions are due at the local sponsor by May 15. The local sponsor will review the submission made by the clubs and forward them on to Parks and Rec if there are no issues before June 1.

Next up is Phase I of the grant application, Prior Approval. Any new trails, trail reroutes or changes to a trail's classification are submitted now and due by June 15. Again the local sponsor reviews the submission and forwards it on to Parks and Rec before July 1.

OPRHP oversees grant program.

Phase II is the actual Trail Funding application submitted by the local sponsor to Parks and Rec. There will be supporting documentation from the clubs to justify the grants. The application is due by September 1.

The disbursement of the grant funding is done in two phases, the first being 70% of the grant award usually made at the beginning of the snow season. The second is 30% and will generally come in

the late summer or early fall after the season has ended.

This is done to allow for seasonal weather changes that affect grooming. For example, a club received the 70% award in January and then all the snow melted and no more grooming occurred that season. After all the work logs were turned in, it was found that the club had spent 15% more than the 70% award covered, for a total of 85% of the total award. The club would receive 15% of the remaining 30% award.

In another example, a club had a very active winter, with a lot of grooming. The club spent the entire 70% award and had to use reserve funds to keep up with the grooming. Now at the end of the season the club finds it had spent

enough to receive the entire 30% award in the fall. They will likely have spent more but will not receive more than the award.



Now imagine this whole process duplicated 5 times, that is what the Frontier Sno Riders deal with each season. There are 5 local sponsors, including the counties of Montgomery,

Schenectady, Schoharie, and the towns of Berne and Knox.

Each local sponsor files an application for Frontier because our trails pass through each municipality. Not only that, Montgomery County has an association act as the local sponsor, the Mohawk Valley Snowmobile Club Inc.

Parks and Rec is looking to streamline the grant process by making most of it computer based, all trails recorded by GPS, automated online work logs, and tracking of groomers. Every bit helps, but change takes time.

NYSSA is looking to take charge of the grant process which could change how the whole process is handled.

One thing is for sure, it will change and we need to be ready for whatever happens.
