Snowmobile Registration Deadline Approaches

Register This! Every year the club reminds members to register their snowmobile before the end of November. Why is registering so important at this point in time? Trail funding is determined by registrations.

It is true you can register your snowmobile after November, but your registration dollars will not count toward the important trail funding determination for the coming season unless you beat the deadline.

Trail funding for grooming and maintenance is based on registration numbers. The more snowmobiles registered equals more trail funding for grooming.

Many folks in Frontier-land will wait until the snow is actually on the ground before registering their snowmobile. While this may sound pru-



dent, it can backfire. For example, when there is a winter in which a lot of snow fell early, and the club had spent all the funds it had for grooming, and then more snow fell late in the season, the trails may not get groomed.

Another reason for registering now is to get ahead and be prepared for when the snow flies. Many club members wait until the snow is on the ground and then scramble to get to DMV to register their snowmobile.

If members realize they will almost always have a chance to ride their snowmobile at some point

on the trail, they should register now rather than waiting for the snow. There have been seasons in which little snow has fallen, like the winter of 2016, but those are very rare. Many seasons however help keep our average snowfall in a range which allows for our trails to be open.


The trails require a lot of maintenance. Not only grooming, but signage and clearing brush. Funding and volunteers are how maintenance is provided.

There are some folks who will not register their snowmobiles. They are willing to risk getting a ticket for operating an unregistered snowmobile. Tickets are more expensive than registration.


East Berne Fire House was toured at the October meeting. Facilities/property for groomer storage and meeting/classroom were seen by members.


Adopt A Highway


