Arctic Cat to cease operations in Thief River Falls, St. Cloud

Thief River Falls, MN (Valley News Live) Arctic Cat is suspending manufacturing indefinitely at its facilities in Thief River Falls and St. Cloud.

Citing weak market demand, production is set to stop in the first half of 2025 after fulfilling current customer commitments.

An employee tells us the news was shocking. saying: "I found out through the grapevine and social media. So. we.. A lot of us that are laid off didn't have any idea this was coming today."



2000 Pisten Bully 100 painting project and cab refresh coordinated by Chad Saddlemire has been completed by Albany BOCES. Groomer appears outstanding.

PB070 evaluated and test run in early snow. Ordered a few parts from dealer - awaiting arrival. Battery will require replacement for cold starts.

2012 JD Gator experienced a third track failure (complete belting separation) after the November storm. Recommendation to replace both front tracks to avoid a failure of the fourth original track during grooming. Board approved Motion to replace both tracks and track parts have been ordered from Randall Implements. Mattracks have not proven reliability in the long run for Frontier.

Skandics and CanAm have been evaluated. Three Skandic batteries require replacement and a new filter needed for atv along with an oil change kit for the two Skandic four strokes.

Gerry L requested landowner John Cochran to consider hosting in season storage of PB070 inside large barn for East Berne crew to utilize. No response as of yet.

and drag, better known as the BLUE PIG! With the terrain our club maintains in our 90-mile trail system the Blue Pig was under powered and difficult to navigate in varied terrain. When the PB 100 arrived to now maintain the trails in Albany and Schenectady counties, that's when the hands-on work began. The club went from having 4 to 6 foot trail system to now having 8 to 10 foot trail system to be able to groom our trails with the PB 100. Also, the club invested a lot of money building new bridges to be able

to support the weight of the PB 100 throughout the trail system.

Frontier Sno Riders has now owned the PB 100 for several years and if you have had the opportunity to ride our trail system after the PB 100 rolls out the white ribbon you know how great this groomer has been for the club trail system. At the end of the 2024 riding season or should we say the three years of a non riding season in our area, the Frontier Sno Riders board members voted in favor of the Capital Region BOCES Autobody program to give the PB 100 a face lift. The club dropped off the PB 100 last May to the brand new Autobody BOCES program based in the Capital District. The students in the Autobody and Auto Service program really went to town on this project. The students in the Autobody program removed all brush guards, lights, and mirrors to prep the cab and frame prior to going into the paint booth. After the PB 100 was completed

bed. Without Karl donating his equipment, time, barn, property, and more over the years, the club would not be what it is to-



While conditions may have looked great, trails were closed until after the holiday hunt. Please abide by the rules, and register your snowmobile!






















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
